

Bea in her Bonnet

Supply List

- Standard sewing equipment: sewing machine, pins, sewing shears etc.
- ¼ yard (0.25 m) high thread count cotton in white or cream for the body (I prefer *Pimatex* cotton)
- Mechanical pencil
- Purple fade away marker
- Fabric Eraser
- Cotton wrapped polyester thread (such as *Gutermann*) to match fabrics
- New machine needle (size 11)
- Open Toe Foot for sewing machine
- High Quality stuffing (I prefer *Fairfields*)
- Haemostats (American spelling is hemostats, also called forceps)
- Barbara Willis' small stuffing fork or similar
- 6 pipe cleaners (the type sold in tobacco shops)
- Wire cutters
- *Fray Check*
- Patti Culea's *Itsy Bitsy Finger Turners* or similar
- White floral tape
- Strong thread to match white or cream fabric
- Hand sewing needles including; a doll sculpting needle (I prefer *John James Long Darners #7*) and a long (approx 5") doll needle
- Lead shot or teddy bear weights for weighting body
- 1" foam brush
- *Tim Holtz's Distress Ink Re-inkers* in Tea-dye and Worn Lipstick
- Plant spritzer for water
- *Prismacolor* Pencils – Sienna brown for shading, cream, white, 3 colours for eyes, ochre, pink, peach (optional extra colour or two for eye shadow)
- *Zig Millennium* Pens – nib size 0.005 in brown and black
- Gel pens in white, 1 eye colour (for outlining iris), black (I prefer *Sakura*)
- White acrylic paint
- Toothpicks
- Spray fixative (*Krylon* or *Winsor & Newton*)
- ½ yard (½ metre) cotton print for dress
- Fat quarter cotton print for bloomers
- 11" x 11" (28cm x 28cm) piece of silk for skirt lining
- ¼ yard (¼ metre) of fine netting for crinoline
- 1 lady's sock
- Ballpoint machine sewing needle
- 1 yard (1 metre) trim for embellishing skirt and bodice
- 2 3/16 tiny buttons for sleeves
- 12" (31 cm) trim for bloomers
- 6" x 3" (15cm x 8cm) piece of Tibetan lamb hair (or handful loose Mohair, if preferred)

- Fabric glue (*Fabric TAC* or *Hi-Tac Fabric Glue*)
- 1 square synthetic felt – either acrylic or polyester such as *Kunin* felt
- Spatula (to be used for paint)
- Heat gun
- 1 colour Galactica paint by *Stewart Gill* (or *Lumiere* by *Jacquard*) for wings
- 1 small piece of photo paper or an unwanted photo for stencil
- *Exacto* knife or similar
- Fine wire 26 gauge (0.5 mm) in complimentary colour for hat and wings (I used two different colours, but as I painted over the wire on wings the colour doesn't matter)
- Silk, cotton or rayon thread (these withstand heat) to co-ordinate with wings, although it will be painted over so colour is not hugely important
- 8" x 5" (20cm x 13cm) *Tyvetex* or *Fibretex* fabric (the soft, flexible type)
- 3 colours Fabric paint (I used 1 colour each of *Stewart Gill Byzantia*, *Metallica* and *Colourise*) if you want a more solid hat. If you want a lacy effect use acrylic paint instead
- Paintbrush
- 5 small bees for her hat (beads, buttons etc, mine are small styrofoam, bees)
- 5 small seed beads for hat (I used size 8)
- Cotton embroidery floss (I used two colours, but one is fine)
- At least 2 colours of size 11 seed bead for necklace
- 1 bee bead or button for necklace
- Beading thread to match beads for necklace (*Nymo*, *C-Lon*, *S-Lon* etc)
- Beading needle size 12
- 3/16" (5mm) diameter dowel, 3 1/2" (9cm) long for honey dipper
- 2 contoured wooden toy wheels 3/4" (1.9cm) diameter x 3/16" (5mm) width x with 3/16" (5mm) hole for honey dipper
- 2 contoured wooden toy wheels 7/8" (2.2cm) diameter X 1/4" (6mm) width X with 3/16" (5mm) hole for honey dipper
- Acrylic paint for honey dipper (I used *Stewart Gill Metallica* again - the same colour I used for the hat. It does work on wood, but you may want a separate paint)
- Acrylic varnish (I use a spray but any type is fine)
- *Marvin Medium*
- 1 large glass jar with 4" (10cm) diameter opening (mine is 7" (18cm) tall)
- Glass paints such as *Vitrea 160* by *Pebeo* in *Saffron Yellow* and *Amber*, plus *Vitrea 160 Thinner*
- 1/2" paintbrush suitable for glass paint
- Paper to run through printer or photocopier for label
- Tacky Glue
